### Definitions: Each type of document must reflect

Professional Practice: The use, by a health care professional, of knowledge and skill to provide a service in the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of illness and in the maintenance of health.

Policy: Statements which specify conditions and /or resources which must be met to facilitate patient care. These statements do not address psychomotor skills that are not negotiable and they do not allow for judgment or interpretation. Policy statements are not included in procedures however they are referred to as

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
